

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK BY FR. OWEN KORTE

MEMORIAL DAY: We have several masses that will be held in our family of parishes. Holy Trinity and St. Jane Frances will have mass at 9am in Church. There will be a mass at South Creek Calvary Cemetery (Ponca) at 8:30 am followed by coffee and rolls. In case of bad weather it will be held at St. Joseph Church.

CEDAR CATHOLIC NEWS: We are moving towards a change in our administrative leadership. The School Board last year chose to move towards a Lay President model for the School. A representative committee has been meeting to help rework our bylaws to reflect that change. This committee was charged with the goal of better uniting the internal life and the school's relationship with the external support systems. Soon we will bring the bylaws to various parish and school groups for their review and input. There have been many changes in how these kinds of documents are written over the years and the new format follows one that is being used by Pope John XXIII High School which was already approved by our Diocesan Attorneys. We have taken that document and tweaked it to reflect our needs and situation. Cedar Catholic Board has functioned as an advisory board to the priest-president and sometimes like a semi-jurisdictional board. Now the board will be more semi-jurisdictional with reserved powers spelled out as belonging to the Archbishop.

SOON TO BE FATHER MATTHEW POHLMAN: remember from last summer, before Thomas Matva began his time with us, Matthew Pohlman spent time with us. Since then Matthew has been ordained a Deacon; in Rome last October. He will be ordained to the Priesthood this coming June 1. Fr. Matthew will be coming back to our parishes for the 6pm mass on June 17th in Plainview and the 10:30am mass at Holy Trinity on June 18th. Come and offer him your prayers and congratulations at these masses. During his last year in Rome Matthew got to do some really neat things. He was one of the Deacons at the Pope's Midnight Mass. At St. Peters the Christ Child statue is at near the altar. Matthew removed the veil revealing the Christ Child and then handed the figure to the Holy Father. Matthew also got to chant the Gospel for Good Friday. Three Deacons chant the Gospel in Latin, in parts like we do when we read the Passion Gospels. He changed the speaker part. The weekend of his Ordination I will be in Omaha for all the events and Fr. Dave will be taking my place.

Precious Things

I once wrote an article about a school that embraced the Reggio Emilia approach to education. This meant, in practice, a lot of fascinating things, and it was a fun piece to work on. But all these years later, I could not accurately describe the Reggio Emilia style of learning to anyone except to say this: they give the kids glass bowls and china plates.

This was a pre-school, and these students were three-year-olds. "If they drop a cup and it shatters, then they learn that glass can break. We clean it up," the teacher said with a shrug. The idea was that a child will never learn to handle a fragile, precious thing — and grow into an adult who can respect and cherish a fragile, precious thing — if they are not sincerely trusted with a precious thing whose fragility they bear personal witness to.

The breaking, you see, was part of the education.


The disciples worshiped, but they doubted. And yet, Christ gave them the Great Commission anyway, something fragile and important, something that could be easily dropped and easily broken. Christ knew who they were, what they were. They were mere human beings, deeply imperfect, scared and hesitant, a little slow on the uptake. He knows that's exactly what we are, too. But he gives us the Great Commission just as he gave it to them. Because that is what the Faith is: it is something perfectly beautiful, passed from one flawed person to another, throughout the ages — constantly dropped, constantly broken, and constantly, miraculously, pieced back together again.







The Most Holy Trinity

Once I was at a meeting with representatives of various religions. On a coffee break, a man from another religion mused to me: "You know, with all our differences, all religions are really about being good people." I lowered my cappuccino and said as warmly as I could, "That's not what mine's about." His quizzical look begged for clarification. "Mine is about plunging into the life of God," I said.

Just before Jesus ascends into heaven, he commands the eleven apostles, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20). The word "baptize" means "to immerse in, to plunge into." It presupposes the use of water. But what does it mean to be immersed in God's name? In the Bible, God's name is identical to God Himself. So, to be baptized into water, using Jesus' formula, is to be plunged into the life of God. Said another way, it is to die with Jesus and rise with him as a member of his body.

The Trinity isn't a doctrine simply to accept and ponder. It's more like an ocean: a mystery into which we are baptized ... inserted, immersed, dunked, plunged. Baptism gives us power to live our lives as beloved children of God, patterned after Jesus himself, who is always with us, until the end of the ages. Hardly the same as being good people. Explaining the Pro-Abortion Ballot Initiative.

Abortion activists, *Protect Our Rights Nebraska*, are gathering signatures to put a right to late-pregnancy abortion on the ballot in November of 2024. Nebraskans need to know how this proposal is dangerous, deceptive, and demeaning, and why it must be opposed.

- X Fifty years of common-sense protections for women and girls against unsafe abortion practices would be eliminated, as illustrated by Michigan after they passed a similar initiative.
- X Teenagers could access abortions without their parents' knowledge.
- X It seeks to embed late-pregnancy abortion into the state constitution, despite evidence showing its high risks and trauma for women and girls.
- X The legislature's ability to enact essential health and safety protections for moms and babies is jeopardized by the phrase "without interference of the state."





- The pro-abortion amendment uses purposefully vague and abstract terms to drastically expand abortion in Nebraska.
- Terms like "viability" can be manipulated by abortionists and are defined so broadly that it will put healthy 2nd & 3rd-trimester babies at risk of being killed by abortion.
- Even babies who require basic neonatal health care could be categorized by an abortionist as not viable, and be aborted.
- X Nebraska law already allows 1st-trimester abortion and provides exceptions for rape, incest, and the life of the mother, which is supported by over 60% of Nebraskans.



- X The abortion industry makes women feel afraid, isolated, and without options. This is at a time when trusted family, friends, churches, and Nebraskans want to support their pregnancy and parenting needs.
- X The amendment is funded by out-of-state special interest groups, including America's largest abortion provider, which stands to profit financially from increased abortions in Nebraska.
- X This proposal will create a culture that incentivizes and expects abortion rather than build a "culture of life" that seeks to fully support pregnant and parenting women, including those in the workplace.

You're probably daydreaming about the annual cabin getaway weekend or waterskiing on the Fourth of July. All in all, summer is going to be a nice break, even if — like typical Americans — our break is full of productive work.

Thank God — literally — that He doesn't take a break, even if we do. Can we try to remember that, even in the midst of our many wonderful distractions? Let's enjoy this summer. Let's live it to the full. But let's see it for the gift that it is — and remember the thanks we owe the Giver. — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS


