Despite the momentum gained from their win over the Cardinals, the Lady Trojans fell short to the Guardian Angels Central Catholic Blue Jays the following night at Battle Creek High School. The Trojans ended the conference week with a loss in a hard fought battle against Pierce. The girls began their Sub-District play on Monday October 31st playing the Hartington-Newcastle Wildcats at Randolph High School, sweeping them Wildcats in three sets! Following an easy win came a difficult game against the Crofton Warriors, battling for the ticket to the District Championship. In a suspenseful, close scoring game, the Lady Trojans fell short in three sets to the Warriors.



Thinking their season was over, the Trojans were in for a great surprise when they won the District Wildcard, providing them the second chance for a trip to State! The team took on the Ponca Indians, ranked No. 2, searching to avenge their previous loss to them. Taking the court with fire and determination, the Trojans controlled the game, bringing home the District Championship title!

The team will be heading to the State Tournament in Lincoln, NE, on Thursday, November 10 for the first time since claiming state in 2012. The Trojans will be taking on the No. 1 seed Diller-Odell (31-3) at 1:30 at Lincoln Southwest High School.
